Home Health Aide

What You Need to Know

Home Health Aides will typically monitor the health status of an individual with disabilities or illness, and address their health-related needs, such as changing bandages, dressing wounds, or administering medication.

Home Health Aides will provide assistance with routine healthcare tasks or activities of daily living, such as feeding, bathing, toileting, or ambulation and may also help with tasks such as preparing meals, doing light housekeeping, and doing laundry depending on the patient's abilities.

On the job, you will:

- Maintain records of patient care, condition, progress, or problems to report and discuss observations with supervisor or case manager.
- Provide patients with help moving in and out of beds, baths, wheelchairs, or automobiles and with dressing and grooming.
- Bathe patients.
